General Maintenance & Cleaning

Regular Dusting:

Use a soft, dry cloth to dust both the stone and anodized aluminum parts regularly. This prevents the accumulation of dirt and grime.

Cleaning Spills Immediately:

Wipe up any spills on the stone surface immediately with a soft, absorbent cloth to prevent staining.

Natural Stone:

Daily Cleaning: Use a pH-neutral cleaner specifically designed for natural stone. Apply the cleaner with a soft cloth or sponge and wipe down the surface.

Deep Cleaning: For thorough cleaning, mix warm water with a few drops of mild dish soap. Use a soft cloth or non-abrasive sponge to clean the surface, then rinse with clean water and dry with a soft towel.

Use Coasters and Placemats:

Always use coasters, placemats, and trivets to protect the stone surface from hot items, scratches, and spills.

Handling and Moving**Lifting Properly:**

Always lift the furniture; do not drag it. Dragging can damage both the stone and anodized aluminum parts.

Use Protective Pads:

Place felt or rubber pads under the furniture legs to prevent scratches on the floor and reduce stress on the joints.

Anodized Aluminum Parts:

Regular Cleaning: Use a mixture of mild dish soap and warm water. Wipe the anodized aluminum parts with a soft cloth soaked in the soapy water, then rinse thoroughly with clean water and dry with a soft cloth.

Avoid Abrasives: Do not use abrasive pads, brushes, or cleaners on anodized aluminum, as they can scratch and damage the protective anodized layer.

Stain and Residue Removal: For stubborn stains or residues, use a specialized aluminum cleaner. Apply with a soft cloth, following the cleaner's instructions, and rinse thoroughly.
